Admission of John Paull 30th June 1865

Manor of Stainswick } At a Special Court Baron of the President of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford and The Scholars of the said College Lords of the said Manor held the thirtieth day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixty five Before Henry Pullen Gentleman Deputy Steward for this turn and purpose only of Edward Blagrave Gentleman Chief Steward of the said Manor.

To this Court came John Paull of Brockley Hall near Bristol in his own properperson and prayed that he by virtue of Surrender dated the eleventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixth five made and duly passed to him by Charles Hibbard of the Parish of Fernham in the County of Berks Yeoman James Hibbard of Stanton Park Farm in the Parish of Stanton in the County of Wilts Yeoman and Elizabeth Hibbard of No.4 Sion Hill Cifton in the City of Gloucester Widow might be admitted Tenant to the Lorde of thie Manor according to the custom thereof All those copyhold or customary messauges lands tenements and hereitaments whatsoever within and parcel of the said Manor of or to which the said Charles Hibbard James Hibbard and Elizabeth Hibbard were admitted Tenants at a Court held in and for the said Manor on the eleventh day of June last past so surrendered to him as aforesaid with the appurtenances To whom the Lords of this Manor by their said Deputy Steward did grant and deliver seizin

thereof by the rod according to the custom of the said Manor **To hold** the said premises aforesaid with the appurtenances unto the said John Paull his heirs and assigns forever at thw will of the Lords according to the custom of the said Manor and by the rents customs and services therefore due and of right accustomed And he divest the Lords for Fines for his Admission unto the first Tenement Nineteen shillings and nine pence and for his Admission unto the other Tenement Six pence and his fealty is respited.
