In the yeare of our Lord God 1673 & of the Reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles the Second by the grace of God of England Scotland France & Ireland &c. the five & twentieth I John Pope Sen. Of Ogbourne St. George husbandman being sicke in body but (blessed be God) of perfect memory doe make this my last will & testament in manner and forme following

ffirst I bequeath my Soule to God my maker and redeemer & body to be committed to the earth hoping for a blessed resurrection.

Item: I give to my daughter Alice Liver living at Stephenton One Shilling [Steventon, Berks?]

Item: I give to my daughter Lucie Meggs the summe of forty pounds which she shall receive a yeare & an halfe after my decease.

My dwelling house my barne, Cow house and stable with ye rest of my Goods not bequeathed I give to my son John whom I make sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament in witnesse where of I have put my hand & seale the day & yeare above written.


