Inprimis: I give to my sister Alice her son William Lyford One Shilling and to her seaven other Children Twenty Shillings apeece.

Item: I give to my Brother in Law William Meggs and to his ffive Children Twenty Shillings apeece

Item: I give to my Godson John Eyles Twenty Shillings

Item: I give to my Servant Maid Judith Garlicke Ten Pounds

All which Legacies to be paid in Twelve Months next after my decease

Item: All the rest of my goods Chattles household Stuff and other my personall estate whatsoever my debts and Legacies paid, I give and bequeath unto my said Sister's and my Brother in Law's Children (except the said William Lyford) to be equally divided amongst them, And my Will is that the Debt I owe on Mortgage be charged only on my Land and not on my personall estate

Item: I doe make my loving ffrinds William Creech and John Moor Exe[cuto]rs in Trust of this my Last Will and Testament deveing[?] them to see it duely performed and I give them Twenty Shillings apeece for their paines, therein In Witnefs whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Dat the Second day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seaven Hundred and Eleaven
