These are to Certify that on the twenty fourth day of June in the year One Thousand eight hundred and forty three before us John Matthews and John Cooker

two of the Perpetual Commissioners appointed for the *City and County* of *Oxford* for taking the Acknowledgments of Deeds by Married Women, pursuant to an Act passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, instituted "An Act for the Abolition of Fines and Recoveries, and for the Substitution of more simple Modes of Assurance," appeared personally *Ann* the Wife of *John George*

and produced a certain Indenture **A** bearing date the twenty fourth day of June in the year One Thousand eight hundred and forty three

and made between John George of the Parish of Saint Clements in the Inburbs of the City of Oxford Blacksmith and Anne his Wife of the first part Robert Rogers of Steeple Aston in the County of Oxford Blacksmith of the second part and George Woodford of the Parish of Ebbe in the City of Oxford Butcher of the third part

and Acknowledged the same to be her Acy and Deed: AND WE DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that the said Ann George

was at the time of her Acknowledging the said Deed, of full Age and competent Understanding, and that she was examined by us apart from her Husband, touching her knowledge of the contents of the said Deed, and that she freely and voluntarily consented to the same
